WHEREAS, on September 23, 2022, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order No. 2022-218, declaring a state of emergency in the State of Florida for Tropical Depression Nine (n/k/a Hurricane lan); and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2022, the City Manager of the City of Venice enacted Executive Order No. 2022-01 that declared a Local State of Emergency due to Hurricane Ian constituting a potential life-threatening situation for the citizens and visitors to the City of Venice; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 252.38, Florida Statutes, the limitation of an emergency declaration is seven (7) days, which may be extended in seven (7) day increments as necessary; and

WHEREAS, on September 28, 2022, Hurricane Ian made landfall as a strong Category 4 hurricane in Lee County, impairing the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Venice; and

WHEREAS, conditions continue to exist requiring the extension of the initial Declaration.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edward F. Lavallee, City Manager of the City of Venice, in accordance with the provisions of the State of Florida Office of the Governor Executive Order No. 2022-218, Chapter 252.38, Florida Statutes, and Executive Order No. 2022-01 hereby promulgate the following extension to the initial Declaration:

- 1. A State of Local Emergency continues to exist within the City of Venice due to Hurricane Ian.
- 2. The initial Declaration of Local State of Emergency signed on September 26, 2022, and extended on October 3, 2022, for a period of seven (7) days through October 9, 2022, is further extended for an additional seven (7) days, from Monday, October 10, 2022, through October 16, 2022.
- 3. For purposes of payroll calculation, while the Emergency Declaration Period is in effect, you should also consider the Emergency Pay Period to be cancelled effective Sunday, October 9, 2022.
- 4. Section 8 of the City's emergency pay policy, adopted by the City Council in Resolution 2019-13, no employee is allowed to work more than 16 hours in a 24-hour period unless their regular duty hours require him or her to work more. During the current pay period and in response to Hurricane Ian, some employees had to work more than 16 hours in a 24-hour pay period in order to address public health, safety, and welfare. Pursuant to my emergency management powers, I am hereby waving the 16-hour restriction for this pay period.

5. As a result of this extension, the Declaration of Local State of Emergency extends continuously from September 26, 2022, through October 16, 2022, inclusive.
